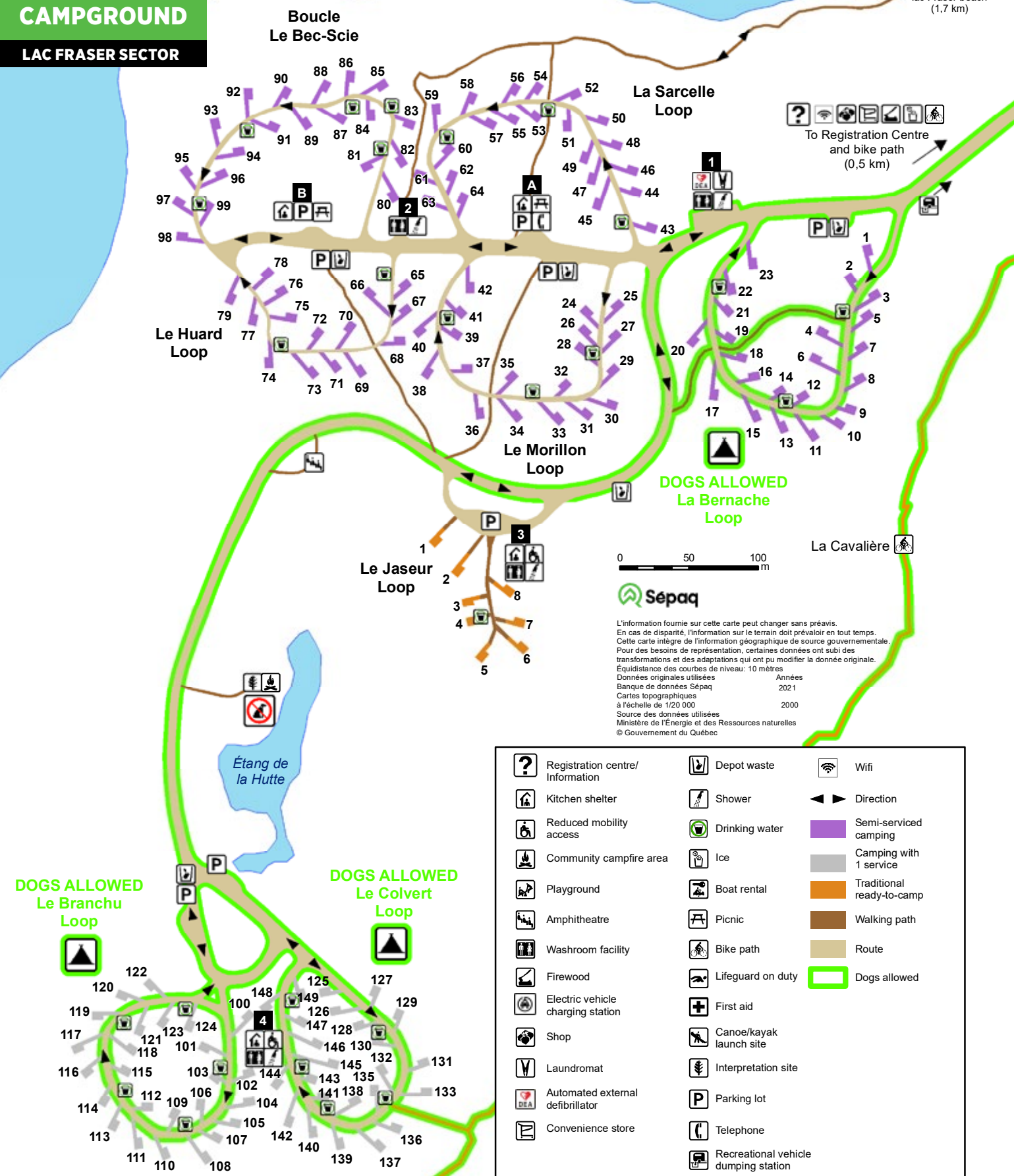
CAMPSITE RULES

- Do not leave traces of food or odorous products (including dishwasher) within reach of animals to avoid attracting them.
- To maintain campground peace, curfew is in effect from 11:00 p.m. to 8:00 a.m. and moderate use of generators and air conditioners is tolerated between 10:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m.
- Music: If you wish to listen to music outside, we ask you to use headphones.
- A campsite can accommodate up to six people (maximum of four adults for a traditional ready-to-camp).
- A campsite can accommodate a maximum of two tents or one registered set of recreational equipment, one tent, and a bottomless kitchen tent where size permits.
- A maximum of two vehicles may be parked per space if parking is permitted and accessible.
- Campfires or cooking fires are permitted in areas set up for this purpose and must be under constant supervision. Be sure to put out the fire before leaving or going to bed.
- The installation of a tarp or rope clothesline is permitted within the limits of the site but must be removed after use.
- The maximum speed allowed in camping sectors is 10 km/h.
- Bringing any animal, except guide dogs and dogs on a leash to designated areas, is prohibited. Consult the rules and authorized areas in the Discovery Guide or at sepaq.com/animals and please respect the signposting to this effect.
